## 1971 sampling fractions by sex and age

Young people in their early 20s had the lowest sampling fraction (1.02). This was due to the high 'not-traced' rates for young people (see Table T71.1 describing 'not traced' rates by sex and age for 1971 LS sample members).

Overall, males had slightly higher sampling fractions than females, with a total observed sampling fraction of 1.06 for males compared with 1.05 for females.

Among 25- to 44-year-olds, females had lower sampling fractions than males. It is possible that the lower values among females in this age group were due to some women not providing GPs with the change in their name when they married. This is supported by lower sampling fractions for married women at ages 25 to 44 when compared with married women in other age groups (see Table S71.2).

The largest difference between observed and expected sampling fractions (0.04) was found among females aged 55 to 59 and 75 and over.

## 1971 sampling fractions by sex, age and marital status

Observed sampling fractions varied by marital status and were at their lowest for divorced Longitudinal Study (LS) members (1.02). Never-married and widowed LS members had observed sampling fractions of 1.04. Sampling fractions were highest for married LS members (1.06).

There were relatively small differences between the sexes in the observed sampling fractions for different marital statuses. The biggest difference was between divorced men and women, at 1.04 and 1.01 respectively.

There were substantial differences in the observed sampling fractions for different age groups, but in many cases the calculation was based on small numbers (for example, the observed sampling fraction of 1.17 for divorced males aged 20 to 24 was based on just 34 LS members).

Observed sampling fractions were low, at around 1.00, for never-married LS members of both sexes in their 20s.

Among married LS members, sampling fractions were highest for 16- to 19-year-olds ( 1.15 males and 1.08 for females) and 55 - to 59 -year-olds ( 1.10 and 1.09 ).

Sampling fractions were particularly low for male divorcees aged 60 and over, at around 0.9 , but there was no corresponding pattern for female divorcees.

Differences between observed and expected sampling fractions were typically higher where the calculations were based on small numbers so should be interpreted with care. The most consistent pattern was among male divorcees aged 60 and over, for whom observed values were lower than expected.

## 1971 sampling fractions by sex and socio-economic group

There were variations in sampling fractions for different socio-economic groups in 1971. The highest observed sampling fraction (1.13) was found among self-employed professional workers and the lowest (0.85) among people in the armed services. However, care should be applied when interpreting these figures because of the small number of Longitudinal Study members involved.

Among males, the highest observed sampling fraction (1.13) was for self-employed professional workers, and the lowest (0.85) for men in the armed forces.

Among females, the highest observed sampling fraction (1.18) was for women farmers (employers and managers), and the lowest ( 0.90 ) for women in the armed services.

Again figures in the armed services are influenced by the high not-traced rates for these groups (see Table T71.4b describing 'not traced' rates by sex and socio-economic group for economically active 1971 LS sample members aged 15 and over).

## 1971 sampling fractions by sex and social class

In 1971, people in different social classes had similar sampling fractions and there was little variation by sex. However, residual categories had lower sampling fractions: for example, people whose occupation was inadequately described (0.98) and people in the armed services (0.85). These groups also had high not-traced rates: 13.0 and 6.7 per cent respectively(see Table T71.5b describing 'not traced' rates by sex and social class for 1971 LS sample members who were economically active and aged 15 and over).

## 1971 sampling fractions by sex and country of birth

Observed sampling fractions for Longitudinal Study (LS) members born outside of the UK were high for a number of countries of birth, despite low tracing rates for these groups compared with those born in the UK (see Table T71.6b describing 'not traced' rates by sex, age and country of birth for 1971 LS sample members).

Sampling fractions were lowest for those born in the USA (0.64), which may be attributable to the large proportion of USA-born people in England and Wales who are armed forces personnel and the associated difficulties in enumerating transient groups.

Sampling fractions were highest for those born in 'New Commonwealth' countries of Pakistan (1.42), India (1.34) and the 'Mediterranean' (1.23). Low tracing rates for these groups generate low expected sampling fractions ( $0.81,0.91$ and 0.89 , respectively). The large difference between observed and expected values is the result of date-of-birth preferences among those born in these countries, leading to over-representation in the LS.

Within the 'New Commonwealth' countries of birth with high sampling fractions, values for males were higher than for females. For example, observed sampling fractions for those born in Pakistan were 1.50 for males and 1.20 for females. Corresponding figures for India were 1.40 and 1.27, and for the 'Mediterranean', 1.27 and 1.18.

## 1971 sampling fractions by sex and type of establishment

Please note that calculations for many of the communal establishment categories are based on small numbers of people in the Longitudinal Study (LS) and should be interpreted with care.

People enumerated in communal establishments in the 1971 LS sample had low sampling fractions overall, at 0.88 . The exceptions were people living in homes for older people; this group had a sampling fraction of 1.04.

Among males, sampling fractions for people living in communal establishments were low, with the exception of men enumerated in homes for older people, who had an observed value of 1.10.

Among females, sampling fractions for people living in communal establishments were also low. The highest sampling fraction was for females living in children's homes (1.03) and the lowest for people in places of detention (0.71).
