

SUMMARY

CPIH

The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) is the most comprehensive measure of inflation. It extends the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) to include a measure of the costs associated with owning, maintaining and living in one's own home, known as owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH), along with council tax. Both of these are significant expenses for many households and are not included in the CPI.

Aside from including owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH) and council tax, CPIH is otherwise identical to CPI. This means that, aside from these two components, the factors contributing to the CPI rate are the same as those contributing to the CPIH. For example, if food is reported as increasing the CPIH rate, it is also acting to increase the CPI rate. The size of the contributions for components other than OOH and council tax are exaggerated in the CPI compared with the CPIH because they account for a larger proportion of the overall index.

CPIH is not currently a <u>National Statistic</u>. It has been reassessed by the Office for Statistics Regulation (OSR) against the standards set out in the <u>Code of Practice for Official Statistics</u>. The <u>assessment report</u> published on 3 March 2016 included a number of requirements that need to be implemented for CPIH to regain its status as a National Statistic and we are working to address these.

The main movements for CPIH in June 2017 are:

- The all items CPIH is 103.5, unchanged from last month.
- The all items CPIH annual rate is 2.6%, down from 2.7% in May.
- The annual rate for CPIH excluding indirect taxes, CPIHY, is 2.4%, down from 2.6% last month.
- The OOH component of CPIH is 104.2, unchanged from last month.
- The OOH component annual rate is 2.0%, down from 2.1% last month.
- The CPIH all goods index is 101.3, down from 101.7 in May.
- The CPIH all goods index annual rate is 2.6%, down from 3.0% last month.
- The CPIH all services index is 105.1, up from 104.9 in May.
- The CPIH all services index annual rate is 2.5%, down from 2.6% last month.

Consumer Prices Index (CPI)

The CPI continues to be a National Statistic and is a measure of consumer price inflation produced to international standards and in line with European regulations. First published in 1997 as the



Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP), the CPI is the inflation measure used in the Government's target for inflation.

The CPI is also used for purposes such as uprating pensions, wages and benefits and can aid in the understanding of inflation on family budgets. For more information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for CPI in June 2017 are:

- The all items CPI is 103.3, unchanged from last month.
- The all items CPI annual rate is 2.6%, down from 2.9% in May.
- The annual rate for CPI excluding indirect taxes, CPIY, is 2.5%, down from 2.7% last month.
- The annual rate for CPI at constant tax rates, CPI-CT, is 2.4%, down from 2.7% last month.
- The CPI all goods index is 101.3, down from 101.7 in May.
- The CPI all goods index annual rate is 2.6%, down from 2.9% last month.
- The CPI all services index is 105.5, up from 105.1 in May.
- The CPI all services index annual rate is 2.7%, down from 2.8% last month.

Retail Prices Index (RPI)

In accordance with the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007, the Retail Prices Index and its derivatives have been assessed against the Code of Practice for Official Statistics and found not to meet the required standard for designation as National Statistics. The <u>full</u> <u>assessment report</u> can be found on the UK Statistics Authority website.

The RPI is a legacy measure of UK inflation that continues to be published because of its use in long-term contracts and index-linked gilts. For further information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for RPI in June 2017 are:

- The all items RPI is 272.3, up from 271.7 in May.
- The all items RPI annual rate is 3.5%, down from 3.7% last month.
- The annual rate for RPIX, the all items RPI excluding mortgage interest payments (MIPs) index, is 3.8%, down from 3.9% last month.
- The all goods RPI is 206.1, down from 206.3 in May.
- The all goods RPI annual rate is 3.9%, down from 4.1% last month.
- The all services RPI is 373.0, up from 370.5 in May.
- The all services RPI annual rate is 3.6%, up from 3.5% last month.

Large downward effects came from:

- Transport, in particular motor fuels. Fuel prices fell by 1.1% between May and June 2017, the fourth successive month of price decreases. This contrasts with the same period last year, when fuel prices rose by 2.2%. Taken together, these movements resulted in prices for motor fuels making a large downward contribution to the change in the rate; and
- Recreational and cultural goods and services, with prices overall falling by 0.1% between May and June 2017, compared with a rise of 0.6% a year ago. This downward effect partially reverses the upward pressure seen between April and May 2017 and comes from a variety of categories, principally data processing equipment, cultural services, and games, toys and hobbies. Each of these individual contributions is relatively small.



Small downward effects came from:


- Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels, where prices overall were little changed between May and June this year compared with a rise of 0.1% between the same months a year ago; and
- Clothing and footwear, where prices overall fell by 1.0% between May and June this year compared with a fall of 0.7% a year ago.

A large upward effect came from:

• Furniture, household equipment and maintenance, where prices overall rose by 0.5% compared with a 0.3% fall a year ago. The upward effect came from prices for a variety of bedroom, kitchen and lounge furniture


A small upward effect came from:

• Food and non-alcoholic beverages, where prices overall fell by 0.2% between May and June this year compared with a fall of 0.4% a year ago.

Bread and cereals

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year but fell a year ago, particularly for breakfast cereals.
- Partially offset by a small downward contribution coming from chilled pizzas, where prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago.

Meat

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year by less than a year ago, with the main downward contributions coming from pork products.

Fish

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year but were little changed a year ago.

Milk, cheese and eggs

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall were little changed this year but fell a year ago, with the main upward contribution coming from yoghurt/fromage frais.

Sugar, jam, syrups, chocolate and confectionery

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year by more than a year ago, particularly for cartons/boxes of chocolates and bags of chocolate sweets.
- Partially offset by small upward contributions coming from bags of non-chocolate sweets and large bars of chocolate.

Food products not elsewhere covered

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago, particularly for cook-in sauces.



Last year, the average price of petrol rose by 2.3 pence per litre between May and June 2016 to stand at 111.0 pence per litre. The average price of diesel fell by 1.4 pence per litre between May and June 2017 to stand at 117.3 pence per litre, compared with a rise of 2.6 pence per litre a year earlier to stand at 112.1 pence per litre.







RECONCILIATION OF CPI AND RPI

(Table 5 of the Consumer Price Inflation Dataset)

This table identifies the main factors contributing to the differences between the unrounded inflation rates for the CPI and the RPI. These differences are broken down into: mortgage interest payments, other housing components excluded from the CPI, other differences in the coverage of goods and services, and the formula effect. The final column titled 'other differences including weights' is derived as a residual.

This table currently compares CPI with RPI. In due course it will be updated to compare CPIH with RPI.


The difference between the CPI and RPI unrounded annual rates in June 2017 was -0.85 percentage points, widening from -0.75 percentage points in May 2017.

The main factor contributing to the widening was:

• Other differences including weights, which increased the RPI 12-month rate relative to the CPI 12-month rate by 0.17 percentage points between May and June 2017. The effect came mainly from Air fares, Games, toys and hobbies and equipment for sport and open air recreation, Fuels & lubricants, and Clothing and footwear. The CPI Accommodation Service Proxy also decreased the CPI 12-month rate by 0.02 percentage points but is excluded from the RPI.

The main off-setting factor was:

• Other housing components excluded from the CPI, which decreased the RPI 12-month rate relative to the CPI 12-month rate by 0.05 percentage points between May and June 2017. The effect came mainly from house depreciation.

HOUSING, WATER, ELECTRICITY, GAS AND OTHER FUELS

Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels

EDF Energy has announced changes to its standard variable electricity and gas tariffs, effective from June 21. Standard variable dual fuel direct debit tariff will increase by 7.2% to £1,160 a year. The standard variable gas tariff will increase by 5.5%, while the standard electricity tariff will increase by 9%. (media.edfenergy.com 12 April 2017)

TRANSPORT

Fuels and Lubricants

- Oil prices edged up to around \$49 a barrel as a slowdown in the increase of rigs drilling in the United States eased concern that surging shale supplies will undermine OPEC-led cuts. U.S. drillers added two oil rigs in the week to July 14, bringing the total to 765. Brent crude LCOc1, the global benchmark, was up 7 cents at \$48.98 a barrel. U.S. crude CLc1 traded at \$46.55, up 1 cent. Oil prices are less than half their mid-2014 level because of a persistent glut, even after the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries, plus Russia and other non-members started a supply-cutting pact in January. (uk.reuters.com 17 July 2017)
- When considering the price of petrol between June and July 2017, it may be useful to note that the average price of petrol rose by 0.8 pence per litre between June and July 2016, standing at 111.8 pence per litre as measured in the CPIH.
- A 1 pence change on average in the cost of a litre of motor fuel contributes approximately
 0.02 percentage points to the 1-month change in the CPIH.

HOUSING (RPI)

Mortgage interest payments (MIPs)

- The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.25% on Thursday 15 June 2017.
 The next announcement and minutes from the Bank of England's Monetary Policy
 Committee are scheduled to be published on 3 August 2017.
- The change in average mortgage interest rates recorded in the RPI was -0.01 percentage points between June and July 2016. The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.5% in June 2016.
- A one percentage point change in the average mortgage interest rate contributes approximately 0.9 percentage points to the 1-month percentage change in the RPI.
