Consumer Price Inflation June 2018

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This note is produced as background briefing for the Consumer Price Inflation Statistical Bulletin. Users who require authoritative figures should use the Consumer Price Inflation Statistical Bulletin or Consumer Price Inflation Dataset.



SUMMARY

CPIH

The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) is the most comprehensive measure of inflation. It extends the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) to include a measure of the costs associated with owning, maintaining and living in one's own home, known as owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH), along with council tax. Both of these are significant expenses for many households and are not included in the CPI.

Aside from including owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH) and council tax, CPIH is otherwise identical to CPI. This means that, aside from these two components, the factors contributing to the CPI rate are the same as those contributing to the CPIH. For example, if food is reported as increasing the CPIH rate, it is also acting to increase the CPI rate. The size of the contributions for components other than OOH and council tax are exaggerated in the CPI compared with the CPIH because they account for a larger proportion of the overall index.

The <u>National Statistics</u> status of the Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) was reinstated on 31 July 2017. <u>A letter</u> from the Director General for Regulation to the National Statistician detailed the actions that were taken to meet the requirements as set out in the <u>CPIH</u> assessment report.

The main movements for CPIH in June 2018 are:

- The all items CPIH is 105.9, unchanged from last month.
- The all items CPIH annual rate is 2.3%, unchanged from last month.
- The annual rate for CPIH excluding indirect taxes, CPIHY, is 2.2%, up from 2.1% last month.
- The OOH component of CPIH is 105.4, unchanged from last month.
- The OOH component annual rate is 1.1%, unchanged from last month.
- The CPIH all goods index is 103.9, down from 104.2 in May.
- The CPIH all goods index annual rate is 2.5%, unchanged from last month.
- The CPIH all services index is 107.3, up from 107.1 in May.
- The CPIH all services index annual rate is 2.0%, down from 2.1% last month.

Consumer Prices Index (CPI)

The CPI continues to be a National Statistic and is a measure of consumer price inflation produced to international standards and in line with European regulations. First published in 1997 as the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP), the CPI is the inflation measure used in the Government's target for inflation.



The CPI is also used for purposes such as uprating pensions, wages and benefits and can aid in the understanding of inflation on family budgets. For more information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for CPI in June 2018 are:

- The all items CPI is 105.8, unchanged from last month.
- The all items CPI annual rate is 2.4%, unchanged from last month.
- The annual rate for CPI excluding indirect taxes, CPIY, is 2.4%, unchanged from last month.
- The annual rate for CPI at constant tax rates, CPI-CT, is 2.3%, unchanged from last month.
- The CPI all goods index is 103.9, down from 104.2 in May.
- The CPI all goods index annual rate is 2.6%, up from 2.5% last month.
- The CPI all services index is 107.9, up from 107.6 in May.
- The CPI all services index annual rate is 2.3%, unchanged from last month.

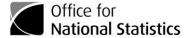
Retail Prices Index (RPI)

In accordance with the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007, the Retail Prices Index and its derivatives have been assessed against the Code of Practice for Official Statistics and found not to meet the required standard for designation as National Statistics. The <u>full</u> <u>assessment report</u> can be found on the UK Statistics Authority website.

The RPI is a legacy measure of UK inflation that continues to be published because of its use in long-term contracts and index-linked gilts. For further information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for RPI in June 2018 are:

- The all items RPI is 281.5, up from 280.7 in May.
- The all items RPI annual rate is 3.4%, up from 3.3% last month.
- The annual rate for RPIX, the all items RPI excluding mortgage interest payments (MIPs), is 3.4%, unchanged from last month.
- The all goods RPI is 214.0, up from 213.8 in May.
- The all goods RPI annual rate is 3.8%, up from 3.6% last month.
- The all services RPI is 383.8, up from 381.6 in May.
- The all services RPI annual rate is 2.9%, down from 3.0% last month.

Large upward effects came from:

• Transport, principally from motor fuels. Petrol prices rose by 2.7 pence per litre between May and June 2018 to stand at 128.0 pence per litre in June, the highest average price since September 2014. This compares with a 1.1 pence per litre fall between the same two months of 2017 to stand at 115.3 pence per litre in June 2017. Similarly, diesel prices rose by 2.9 pence per litre between May and June 2018 compared with a 1.4 pence per litre fall between the same two months a year ago. Within the broad transport group, the upward effect from motor fuels was partially offset by a small downward contribution from air fares, which rose between May and June this year by less than between the same two months a year ago; and



Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels, with domestic gas and electricity prices
rising between May and June this year compared with no change between the same two
months a year ago.

Large downward effects came from:

- Clothing and footwear, where prices of clothing fell by 2.3% between May and June this year compared with a fall of 1.1% between the same two months a year ago. Prices usually fall between May and June as the summer sales season begins but the fall in 2018 is the largest since 2012. The effect came mainly from men's clothing; and
- Recreation and culture, where prices overall fell by 0.4% between May and June this year
 compared with a smaller fall of 0.1% between the same two months a year ago. The main
 effect came from games, toys and hobbies, where prices fell this year by more than a year
 ago, particularly for computer games. Prices for these games are heavily dependent on the
 composition of bestseller charts, often resulting in large overall price changes from month
 to month.

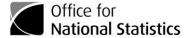
A small downward effect came from:

• Food and non-alcoholic beverages, where prices overall fell by 0.4% this year compared with a smaller fall of 0.2% a year ago.

Bread and cereals

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall were little changed this year but rose a year ago, with the main downward



contribution coming from chocolate biscuits.

Meat

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago, particularly for cooked ham.

Fish

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago, particularly for canned tuna.

Milk, cheese and eggs

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but were little changed a year ago, with the main downward contribution coming from chilled pot desserts.
- Partially offset by a small upward contribution coming from cheese spread, where prices overall rose this year but fell a year ago.

Fruit

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year by more than a year ago.

Sugar, jam, syrups, chocolate and confectionery

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year by less than a year ago, with the main upward contributions coming from bags of chocolate sweets and ice cream.
- Partially offset by a small downward contribution coming from large bars of chocolate.



- Last year, the average price of petrol fell by 1.1 pence per litre between May and June 2017 to stand at 115.3 pence per litre.
- The average price of diesel rose by 2.9 pence per litre between May and June 2018 to stand at 132.1 pence per litre, compared with a fall of 1.4 pence per litre a year earlier to stand at 117.3 pence per litre.

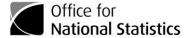

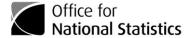

- Vehicle tax and insurance, where average car insurance premiums fell this year but rose a year ago; and, to a lesser extent
- Maintenance of motor vehicles, where prices overall were little changed this year but rose a year ago.

RECONCILIATION OF CPI AND RPI

(Table 5 of the Consumer Price Inflation Dataset)

This table identifies the main factors contributing to the differences between the unrounded inflation rates for the CPI and the RPI. These differences are broken down into: mortgage interest payments, other housing components excluded from the CPI, other differences in the coverage of goods and services, and the formula effect. The final column titled 'other differences including weights' is derived as a residual.

This table currently compares CPI with RPI. In due course it will be updated to compare CPIH with RPI.

The difference between the CPI and RPI unrounded annual rates in June 2018 was -0.95 percentage points, widening from -0.91 percentage points in May 2018.

The main factor contributing to the widening was:

• The formula effect, which increased the RPI 12-month rate relative to the CPI 12-month rate by 0.04 percentage points between May and June 2018. The effect came mainly from recreation and culture.

The main offsetting factor was:

Other differences including weights, which decreased the RPI 12-month rate relative to
the CPI 12-month rate by 0.02 percentage points between May and June 2018. The effect
came mainly from insurance and air fares. This was partially offset by games, toys and
hobbies and equipment for sport and open air recreation.

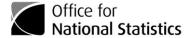

HOUSING, WATER, ELECTRICITY, GAS AND OTHER FUELS

Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels

- Npower has announced a change to its Standard Variable and Juice tariffs. From 17 June
 the cost of a typical dual fuel energy bill will be going up by 5.3%, or £64 a year on average.
 Gas prices will go up by an average of 4.4%. Electricity prices will go up by an average of
 6.2%. (npower.com 11 May 2018)
- SSE has announced an increase to standard electricity and gas prices in a change that will



increase a typical dual fuel bill by an average of 6.7%, effective from 11 July 2018. This rise equates to an increase of 5.7% for gas and 7.7% for electricity, meaning a typical dual fuel customer will see a rise of around £1.50 each week. Customers who are on fixed-price tariffs, have a prepayment meter, or are on the vulnerable customer safeguard tariff will not be affected. SSE Energy Services will also be removing its £6 per fuel per year paperless billing discount from 11 July 2018. (sse.com 30 May 2018)

- E.ON has announced that it is increasing its standard variable electricity and gas prices. On 16 August, the unit price of E.ON's standard variable tariff will increase by an average of 4.8% or £55 for customers taking both fuels, 6.2% or £36 for electricity only customers and 3.3% or £19 for gas only customers. (eonenergy.com 19 June 2018)
- EDF Energy has announced a change to its standard variable tariff prices, effective from 31
 August 2018. EDF Energy's standard variable dual fuel tariff will increase by 6% to £1,228 a
 year. The standard variable electricity and gas tariffs will be increasing by 6.1% and 6%
 respectively. (edfenergy.com 5 July 2018)

TRANSPORT

Fuels and Lubricants

- Oil prices have fallen as concerns about supply disruptions eased and Libyan ports reopened
 while traders anticipated potential supply increases by Russia and other oil producers.
 Benchmark Brent crude fell \$1.69 to a low of \$73.64 before recovering a little to trade around
 \$73.80, down \$1.53. U.S. light crude was down \$1.15 at \$69.86. (uk.reuters.com 16 July
 2018)
- When considering the price of petrol between June and July 2018, it may be useful to note that the average price of petrol fell by 1.4 pence per litre between June and July 2017, to stand at 113.9 pence per litre as measured in the CPIH.
- A 1 pence change on average in the cost of a litre of motor fuel contributes approximately



0.02 percentage points to the 1-month change in the CPIH.

HOUSING (RPI)

Mortgage interest payments (MIPs)

- The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.5% on Thursday 21 June 2018.
 The next announcement and minutes from the Bank of England's Monetary Policy
 Committee are scheduled to be published on 2 August 2018.
- The change in average mortgage interest rates recorded in the RPI was -0.01 percentage points between June and July 2017. The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.25% in June 2017.
- A one percentage point change in the average mortgage interest rate contributes approximately 1.0 percentage points to the 1-month percentage change in the RPI.



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
